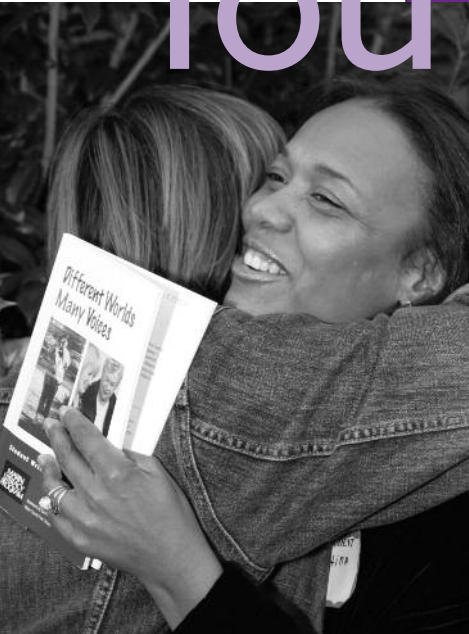

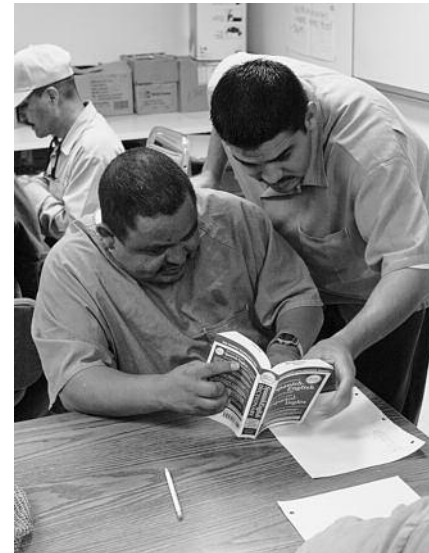

In the past 25 years

Marin Literacy Program has served nearly 9,000 adult students throughout the county thanks to the dedication of over 1,400 trained volunteer tutors.

Adult and Family Literacy Services carefully matches volunteer tutors with Marin residents over 16 years of age who wish to improve their literacy skills. Students are tutored in both one-to-one and small group settings and are offered a variety of additional learning opportunities, such as book clubs, workshops, computer literacy and vocational training. Adult students responsible for children under five are matched with tutors trained in family literacy. These adult students receive monthly Gift Books for all of their children and benefit from Family Storytimes and family literacy workshops.



Inmate Literacy Services helps inmates at San Quentin State Prison and the Marin County Jail who want to improve their literacy and parenting skills. Through Project REACH at San Quentin, inmates work toward their GED and other literacy goals with instruction from trained inmate tutors and community volunteers. FATHERS and MOTHERS Programs teach family literacy and parenting skills to incarcerated men and women with an innovative approach utilizing

children's books. Students choose Gift Books which are sent to each child in their lives. Not only are home libraries started in this way, but new modes of parent-child interaction are set in motion, helping to break the cycles of low literacy and incarceration.

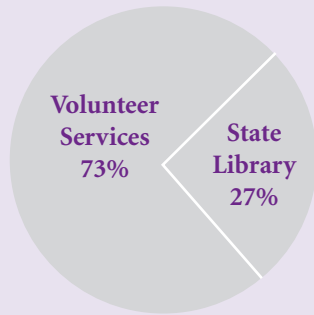
F.L.A.G.ship (Families Learning and Growing)

is a mobile learning center built into a large bus, driven to isolated and underserved areas for weekly stops. Staff welcome caregivers and children under five not attending pre-school to climb on board. The children learn school readiness skills, while parents and caregivers are provided strong support for their role as their child's first teacher.



West Marin Literacy Services

offers English instruction, family literacy, and preparation for the GED and citizenship to second-language learners in rural West Marin. Both one-to-one tutoring sessions and small group classes are offered. Summer Reading Programs on the ranches provide opportunities for isolated families to gain educational ground during school breaks. Annual forums are presented to the community to encourage and inspire families to pursue higher education.



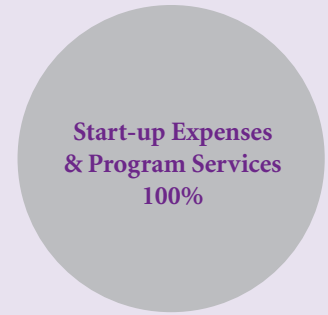

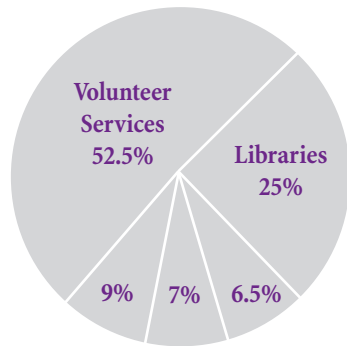

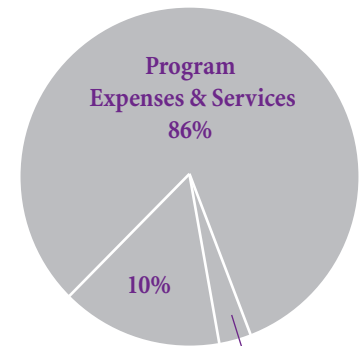

1985

The State Legislature establishes support for library literacy services and launches the California Literacy Campaign (CLC) under the California Library Services Act.

The Marin County

Free Library Literacy

Program is born, with a five-year grant from the California State Library.

With an annual budget of \$31,000, the program begins with five students and by year-end has 51 students and 44 trained tutors.



1986

The **Literacy Council** forms to provide community support for the program.

1987

The **West Marin Literacy Project**, providing ESL services for rural

farmworkers, begins in Olema with a small grant from American Express.

1988

With CLC funding from the State Library, the **San Rafael Library Learning Center** opens as a computer lab.



1990

The **Families for Literacy Initiative**, passed by the State Legislature, provides funding to serve learners with children under 5 with basic skills and family programming in San Rafael and throughout Marin.

Marin County Free Library and San Rafael Public Library jurisdictions sign a joint powers agreement to co-sponsor the literacy program, based in the San Rafael Library.

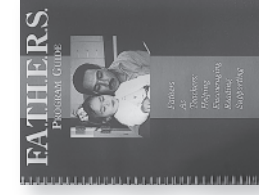

1998

Inmate Literacy Services (ILS) is

born with the financial support of the

Richard and Rhoda Goldman Fund,

through their *Literacy and Life Skills in*

Corrections Initiative. Services begin at

Marin County Jail.

1999

ILS at San Quentin expands with the establishment of **Project R.E.A.C.H.**, an inmate-to-inmate literacy tutoring program.

2001

The Mobile Library Literacy Services statewide grant from California

Children and Families Commission (First 5 California) gives birth to the **F.L.A.G.ship**, one of thirteen mobile literacy units in the state.

Marin Literacy Program earns its accreditation from Literacy Volunteers of America (LVA).

2002

CLC becomes CLLS at the State Library.



Goldman Fund support of ILS ends. Marin County Sheriff's Department begins funding literacy services provided at the Marin County Jail.

Search for grant funders for San Quentin programming begins.

2003

MCFL funds the coordinator of West Marin Literacy as a benefited regular hire position.

2005

LVA's fiscal sponsorship ends. Marin Literacy Program becomes a **non-profit 501(c)(3)**. The Advisory Board becomes the Board of Directors.

The **P.A.R.E.N.T.S. Program Guide** is revised with a grant from Bella Vista Foundation and funding from the California State Library Foundation.

2006

In partnership with San Rafael Public and Marin County Free Libraries, MLP gains a normalized staff position with the establishment of a benefited Program Supervisor.

Marin Literacy's annual **Celebration of Student Authors** event launches, through a partnership with Book Passage and Bank of Marin.



2007

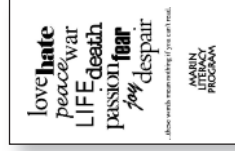
First annual Love of Literacy **Sing-Along Film Fundraiser** opens at the Smith Rafael Film Center.
